We are convinced you come to Company meetings because you get opportunities to see and do things you can't get in any other venue ... and we believe that the facility and program for this conference have never been equaled.

- The Tremont Plaza Hotel The hotel rooms used to be apartments, so every room is really multiple rooms. If you hate to eat out, you could bring groceries and take advantage of the full kitchen in every room. Attention local members: Our \$129 suite price is so low, it compares favorably to your time, traffic and gas expense if you commute home every night! The Grand Historic Venue – The meeting rooms we will be using are in the former Masonic lodge. They are elegant beyond all reason. The flea market and display rooms will make you feel like you're visiting Versailles.
- USS Constellation Our opening reception will be held on board the USS Constellation. What could be better for combining history and socializing?

Additional highlights include:

- Ample flea market / exhibit space. Conference chairman Jeff Goodson is giving the flea market and display area separate rooms adjacent to each other (with a solid wall to minimize cross-over noise), to ensure ample space for all!
- A dual track of talks. In many sessions you can choose talks on our "War of 1812" theme or talks on other periods.
- Friday afternoon trip via chartered water taxi to historic Ft. McHenry. Birthplace of the "Star Spangled Banner".
- Saturday afternoon bus tour of the British amphibious landing at North Point, battle and advance upon Baltimore with on – board historian narrators.
- We have had to raise our prices from last year, (but lower than two years ago), while still keeping everything reasonable. Our location is so convenient that you don't even need to drive; the Tremont Hotel is served by the FREE Charm City Circulator bus which will deliver you to the hotel from the Amtrak or Metro station. 
We have a block of luxury suites at the conference price of \dots \$129.

Easiest access to our display and flea market rooms are from the St. Paul St. side of the hotel. Please see sketch at lower right quadrant of this page.


PARKING INFORMATION:

If you are an overnight guest at the Tremont Plaza Hotel, two parking options are available:

1. Valet parking is available from the front entrance of the Tremont Plaza Hotel at 222 St. Paul Place. We offer 24-hour service that includes unlimited in-and-out privileges for \$15 per night (\$30 for oversized

vehicles). The maximum vehicle height clearance is 6'6". Note this is a special negotiated rate for our group.

2. Self parking is available in a city-owned garage adjacent to the hotel, located at 210 St. Paul Place. This automated 13-story garage is managed by PMS Parking in cooperation with the Baltimore Parking Authority. The weekday maximum overnight parking rate is \$15, and on weekends the maximum rate is \$10 per night. The maximum vehicle height clearance is 7'0". Please note that with the self parking option, you will be charged each time you exit the garage throughout your stay. So if you plan to exit & return during the day we recommend using the hotel valet parking.


